The State Botanical Garden's Georgia Pollinator Plants of the Year program annually recognizes and promotes four top-performing landscape plants that support pollinators and grow beautifully in a garden. Nominations are solicited from gardeners throughout Georgia and are then determined by a selection committee based on each plant's horticultural value, ease of propagation and ecological significance. Plants are chosen from the following categories: Spring Bloomer, Summer Bloomer, Fall Bloomer and Georgia Native.

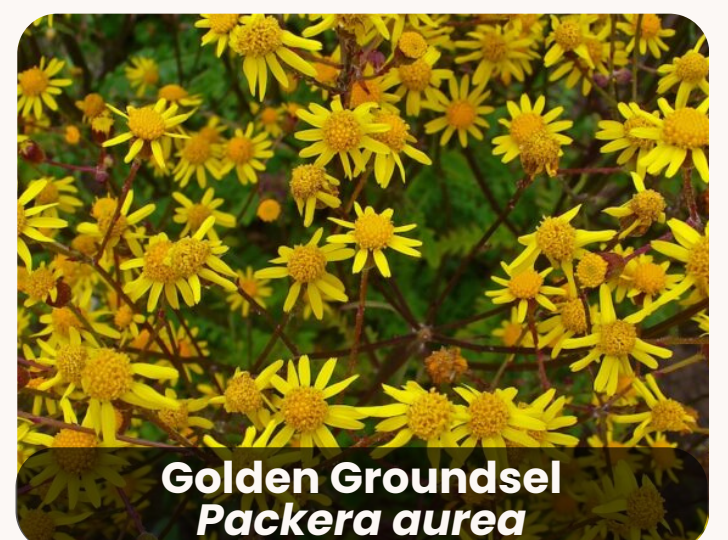
